Term 2 is the 'Christmas Term' full of fun and excitement for the children; the school full of colour and song. Classes are, of course, still covering different aspects of our curriculum with each child working at their own pace and level, supported into their next steps by all our staff.

Literacy and Language

- **Reading** – We will develop our comprehension and reading techniques through various activities.
- **Writing** – We will be working on using non-fiction texts to help us create reports. These will be based on our work in Science and technology.
- **Spelling** – Through dictation and spelling games we will develop different phonemes and reinforce common words.
- **Listening/Talking** – Daily activities including talking partners and group work.
- **French / Mandarin** – revision of numbers to 100, colours, and days of the week / months of the year.

Number Processes and Beyond Number

- **Number Processes** – We are continuing our work on addition and subtraction strategies, through the use of bar models and partitioning we will be solving missing addend problems. We will also be looking at time, and "multiples, factors and primes".
- **Data Handling and Probability** – We will be transferring data from tally charts into bar and line graphs.
- **Shape** - We will also be interpreting data using charts, tables and databases
- **Other Curricular News**
- **Sciences** – We had a mysterious letter arrive to our class from a fairground company asking the class to design a new fair ground ride for his company. We will be investigating the forces found in a fairground as well including electric and magnetism.
- **PE** – Scottish country dancing for the party
- **HWB** – Recognising and dealing with different emotions
- **Technologies** – Developing digital literacy skills, including logging on, saving documents and creating powerpoint presentations.

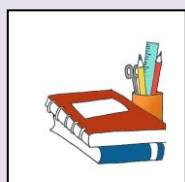

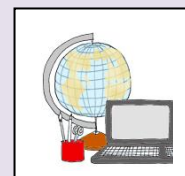
