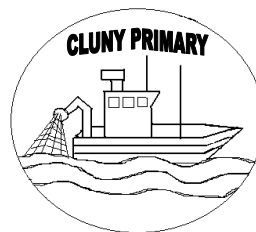

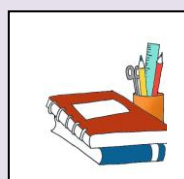
- Exploring the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages.

Other Curricular News

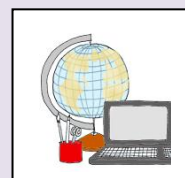
This term we will be:
