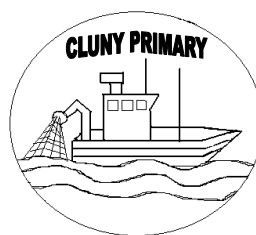

Literacy and Language

- Our focus on phonics this term will be learning the phase 5 sounds and applying these spelling patterns in our writing. We have phase 5 games to consolidate this and will also continue to make up our own sentences, to become more independent with our writing.
- Reading will continue to be a priority and will be heard in class twice weekly. Please ensure your child has practised and understood what they are reading by questioning them about the story. This will help them with their comprehension work too.
- Our writing will be related to topic facts and information, personal recounts, and some book reviews later in the term. A continued focus will be to include basic punctuation and reading through our work to ensure it makes sense.

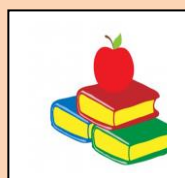
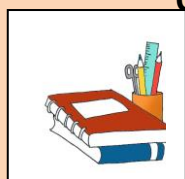
Number Processes and Beyond Number

- We have started to revise skip counting in 2's, 5's and 10's so that children can apply this to their multiplication tables for 2, 5 and 10. We would encourage these tables to be practised at home. Topmarks and YouTube have some fun songs and games online which the children really enjoy and will help them memorise the tables quickly.
- We will also introduce the children to division, using sets of objects which can be shared equally into groups. Later in the term we will introduce basic fractions, with the children becoming familiar with a half, quarter and tenth, making the link with division.
- In Maths we will be looking at different forms of data collection, measurement and money.

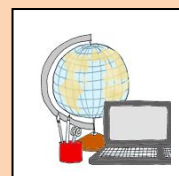
Other Curricular News
